The Global Korea Award

The Global Korea Award (GKA) was created by the Council on Korean Studies at Michigan State University in 1995 to recognize individuals or groups who have made significant contribution of cross-cultural understanding, global education, and well-being of Korean people around the world. The selection criteria for the award include:

- Demonstrated commitment and unselfish devotion to the well-beings of Korean community and global society,
- Significant contribution to the improvement of understanding between Korean and people around the world,
- Exceptional devotion to quality education for young generation in Korea and the world, and
- Outstanding achievement in scholarly and creative work that advances global understanding of Korea in the global community.

Profiles of the 2008 Award Recipients

Heinz Insu Fenkl

Professor Heinz Insu Fenkl is an author, editor, translator, and folklorist. He is professor of English department, and the director of the Interstitial Studies Institute at State University of New York, New Paltz. Prof. Fenkl's work includes Memories of My Ghost Brother, for which he was named a Barnes and Noble "Great New Writer" and a PEN/Hemingway finalist in 1997. He has also published short fiction in a variety of journals and magazines, as well as numerous articles on folklore and myth. Prof. Fenkl was raised in Korea, Germany and the United States. Graduating from Vassar, he received his Master's degree in Creative Writing from the University of California, Davis; he studied literary translation as a Fulbright Scholar in Korea and spent several years in a Cultural Anthropology program, concentrating on Korean folklore, shamanism, and ethnographic theory. Before his appointment to his current position at SUNY, Prof. Fenkl taught a range of courses at Vassar, Bard, Sarah Lawrence, and Yonsei University (Korea). He has published translations of Korean fiction and folklore, and is co-editor of Kori: The Beacon Anthology of Korean American Literature. Prof. Fenkl also writes regular columns on mythic topics for Realms of Fantasy magazine. He lives in the Hudson Valley with his wife, writer and artist Anne B. Dalton, and their daughter Isabella Myong-wol.

Suk-Hi Kim, Ph.D.

Dr. Suk-Hi Kim is professor of finance department at University of Detroit Mercy since 1977. He received his M.B.A. from Pepperdine University and his Ph.D. in

Finance from St. Louis University. He was a Fulbright scholar of international finance at Yonsei University in Seoul, Korea during 1992. As one of the leading scholars in international business, he has authored and coauthored 14 finance textbooks including *Financial Management*, and *Global Corporate Finance*, and 60 referred journal publications. Dr. Kim founded *Multinational Business Review* in 1992 and served on the editorial review boards of many academic journals; *Managerial Finance*, *Journal of International Business and Review*, and *IPS Competitive Report*. According to an article by Allen Morrison and Andrew Inkpen (Journal of International Business Studies, 1st Quarter 1991), Dr. Kim was among the top 25 international business researchers in the 1980s. In addition to college textbooks and academic journal articles, Dr. Kim is also actively engaged in North Korea related issues. He founded *North Korean Review*, and served its editor since 2004. He authored numbers of books including *Economic Sanction against a Nuclear North Korea*, *North Korea-Economic Perspectives and International Cooperation*, and *North Korea at a Crossroads*.

Samuel D. Yoo, M.D.

Dr. Samuel D. Yoo is a self-supporting medical missionary in Uganda. He was dispatched by KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency) to Uganda as a health volunteer in 1992. He is also visiting physician, Department of Medicine at Mulago Hospital, Kampala since 1992. After finishing his internship (1984-1985) and residentship (1985-1988) at Kyungpook National University Hospital, Dr. Yoo served as head of department of medicine at Andong General Hospital during 1991-1992. Dr. Yoo started the bronchoscopy unit in Mulago Hospital in1992. which was not available until then, and educated the Ugandan doctors how to do bronchoscopy. He started pulmonary function test in 2005. He donated Ultrasonic PFT sterilizer with other accessories, developed pulmonology teaching program for PG students, and opened a chest clinic and has been working as the head of pulmonology unit of the Mulago Hospital since it interception in 2006. Dr. Yoo has been teaching and supervising medical students and young physicians in the Makerere University since 1992, working as internal examiner for postgraduate students of Mbrara University of Science and Technology in 2004, and working as external examiner for undergraduate students of Mbrara University of Sciency and Technology in 2007. Dr. Yoo was awarded with a Medal of Merit by Korean President Kim Daejung in 1999, Mulago Hospital award as good worker in 2001, as the most exemplary doctor in the department of Medicine by the staffs of the department.

MEMBERSHIP

ENDOWMENT

The council established an endowment fund in 1992 to provide financial support for its activities. The fund is administrated through the Asian Studies Center in consultation with the Council. A campaign is underway to raise \$2,000,000 in endowment.

The Council has been actively engaged in organizing international conferences, holding a series of workshops and seminars, presenting several cultural events to introduce Korean culture to the large community surrounding MSU, and publishing some publications.
