The Global Korea Award

The Global Korea Award (GKA) was created by the Council on Korean Studies at Michigan State University in 1995 to recognize individuals or groups who have made significant contribution of cross-cultural understanding, global education, and well-being of Korean people around the world. The selection criteria for the award include:

- Demonstrated commitment and unselfish devotion to the well-beings of Korean community and global society,
- Significant contribution to the improvement of understanding between Korean and people around the world,
- Exceptional devotion to quality education for young generation in Korea and the world, and
- Outstanding achievement in scholarly and creative work that advances global understanding of Korea in the global community.

Profiles of the 2016 Award Recipients Seong Chi, M.D.

A native of South Korea Dr. Chi obtained his medical degree from Kyung-Pook National University, Korea. After military service Dr. Chi completed an internship and four-year general surgery residency at Fairview General Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio. He went on to a two-year residence in thoracic surgery at Ingham Medical Center followed by two-year fellowship in thoracic cardiovascular surgery at Toronto University Hospital Circle.

Dr. Chi was recruited back in Ingham by then Medical Director, Arthur L. Stanley, M.D. and president, Edward McRee. He returned to Lansing in 1965 to join the Ingham staff. Just one year later in 1966, Dr. Chi was named Assistant Medical Director and performed mid-Michigan's first open heart surgery at Ingham. Dr. Chi was one of four founding physicians of the Thoracic and Cardiovascular Institute (TCI) in 1969. His professional staff leadership positions included Chief Department of Cardiovascular Surgery (1970-1974) and Executive and Surgical Committee memberships (1969-1974).

In 1987, Dr. Chi was honored with the Health Leadership Award. The Michigan State Senate and House of Representatives passed concurrent resolutions honoring him, as did the Lansing City Council. In 1999, the Lansing State Journal named him one of "100 people of the Millennium". He retired in 1996, having built one of the leading hear programs in the nation.

In 2005, Ingham Regional Medical Center built new heart and surgery center, and its new patient tower has been named the Chi Heart & Surgery Center after medical luminary Seong Chi, M.D.

Robert Turley

Robert Turley is President and Founder of the Korean Art Society (KAS), a non-profit organization that promotes appreciation of Korean art and culture. KAS was founded in 2008 and has grown to over 4,000 members worldwide. They publish the only English-language periodical outside of Korea on Korean art, the Korean Art Society Journal. The first issue of the KAS Journal focused on Korean shaman art, the second issue was a tribute to Zo Zayong, and the third issue was on Korean Buddhist art. Contributors to the KAS Journal include esteemed scholars Robert Buswell (Director of the Center for Korean Studies at UCLA), Lena Kim (Professor Emerita, Hongik University), and Youngsook Pak (Professor Emerita, School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London).

The Korean Art Society has the largest lending library outside of Korea on Korean art, including a number of rare books and publications. Robert says that in many of these books, you will often see a statement such as "Korean art is not well known outside of Korea" or "There is little information on Korean art, and this book seeks to remedy that." From books published over a hundred years ago, to the latest published in just the last few months, the authors have found it necessary to state this condition. Robert started the Korean Art Society to help bring Korean art to the public's notice and to ensure that authors will not have to continue writing that this country's art is a well-kept secret.

Robert Turley funds the Korean Art Society himself, and has never solicited nor accepted any donations or funding. He describes this as merely an attempt to reciprocate the generosity he has always experienced in Korea. In a book Robert is currently working on, he wrote, "I have visited Korea about twenty times, and a perception that has never changed is the feeling that the entire nation wants to cook me dinner, introduce me to their family, and give me a tour of the country."

The Council has been actively engaged in organizing international conferences, holding a series of workshops and seminars, presenting several cultural events to introduce Korean culture to the large community surrounding MSU, and publishing some publications.
