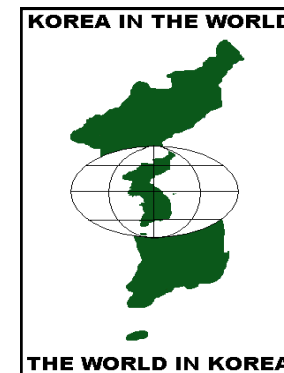

PURPOSE

Council on Korean Studies at Michigan State University was established formally in 1992. The council's main objective is:

To stimulate interest in Korea among the people of Michigan and the United States,

To seek and provide information about the Korean cultural activities,

To exchange programs between Korea and the United States related to art, literature and science,

To help start and continue Korea-related programs at MSU and other American

Promote graduate and undergraduate education about Korea and related outreach programs.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership is open to all people interested in Korean affairs. The president, the officers, and the Governing Board are elected by the members as specified by the Council's bylaws. There are five types of memberships: Corporate Member, Individual Life Time Member, Benefactor, Full Member and Associate Member.

ENDOWMENT

The council established an endowment fund in 1992 to provide financial support for its activities. The fund is administrated through the Asian Studies Center in consultation with the Council. A campaign is underway to raise \$1,000,000 in endowment.

PROFESSORSHIP

Through funding from the Korea Foundation with a matching fund from Michigan State University, the Department of Political Science has established a Professorship in Korean Affairs, beginning in Academic year in 1994. The professor in this position will teach courses in Korean Affairs and organize various academic and cultural activities.

ACTIVITIES

The Council has been actively engaged in organizing international conferences, holding a series of workshops and seminars, presenting several cultural events to introduce Korean culture to the large community surrounding MSU, and publishing some publications.

The Global Korea Award

The Global Korea Award (GKA) was created by the Council on Korean Studies at Michigan State University in 1995 to recognize individuals or groups who have made significant contribution of cross-cultural understanding, global education, and well-being of Korean people around the world. The selection criteria for the award include:

- Demonstrated commitment and unselfish devotion to the well-beings of Korean community and global society,
- Significant contribution to the improvement of understanding between Korean and people around the world,
- Exceptional devotion to quality education for young generation in Korea and the world, and
- Outstanding achievement in scholarly and creative work that advances global understanding of Korea in the global community.

Profiles of the 2002 Award Recipients

Katharine H.S. Moon, Ph.D. Dr. Moon is a Jane Bishop Associate Professor of Political Science at Wellesley College. She is a specialist in International Relations and East Asian Politics, with an emphasis on gender politics and social movement. Dr. Moon is a vocal advocate of women's human rights, migration movement, and gender and militarism. She also works closely with non-government organizations that advocate women's rights and welfare around U.S. military bases in Asia, particularly in South Korea. She is an author of *Sex Among Allies: Military Prostitution in U.S.-Korea Relations*.

Kook Hyun Moon. Mr. Moon has been the President and Chief Executive Officer of Yuhan-Kimberly, Limited, a joint venture between Kimberly-Clark Corporation and Yuhan Corporation, since 1995. He has been a leader of environmental issues for the past 20 years. He initiated "Keep Korea Green," the first company sponsored environmental campaign in Korea in 1984 which promoted "Forest for Schools," "Forest for Life," and "Forest for Peace." Mr. Moon is an instrumental leader in undertaking numerous educational activities for students, newly-weds, and opinion leader on conservational and environmental issues in Korea. His effort for environmental protection and education has been recognized by the United Nations (1997) and Korea/Japan Daily Consortium (1998).

Yoon-Soo Park, Ph.D. for Korean American Scholarship Foundation (KASF). Dr. Park is the Chairman of National Board of Directors of KASF. He has worked tirelessly in search of scholarship funds that is currently endowed for over a million dollars, which is extended to 20 different scholarships. These scholarships are presented every year to select Korean and Korean-American students for the betterment of Koreans globally. Dr. Park was the founding Chair of the Korea-US Science Cooperation Center that helped science centers in Korea and also brought young Korean researchers to the U.S. He was the Chairman of the Centennial Committee of Korean Immigration to the U.S. - Greater Washington. He is currently the Program Director at the Office of Naval Research.

Ung Soo Kim, Ph.D. Dr. Kim is the Chairman of Board of Directors of the International Council on Korean Studies (ICKS), a non-profit and non-partisan organization dedicated to the advancement of Korean Studies and related academic and professional activities in the United States and abroad through conferences, seminars, publication, and other relevant activities. He is a professor emeritus of the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. His research and teaching interests have included economic development and quantitative economics. Dr. Kim was a founding member of Korean Army and has served as the 2nd ROK Infantry Division Commander during the Korean War and the 6th Corp Commander before his retirement.

Jurgen Kleiner, J.D. Ambassador Kleiner served for 34 years in the German Foreign Service. As a career diplomat, he has been the German ambassador to number of countries around the world, including the Republic of Korea (1985-1992), the Republic of Nigeria (1992-1995), and Pakistan (1995-1998). In addition, he served as the Deputy Chief of Mission in Korea (1974-1977), and Hungary (1977-1979). Currently, Ambassador Kleiner is a faculty member at the Boston University, teaching Korea and International Relations, as an expert of Korean relations. His authorships include, *Korea: A Century of Change*.
