The Global Korea Award

The Global Korea Award (GKA) was created by the Council on Korean Studies at Michigan State University in 1995 to recognize individuals or groups who have made significant contribution of cross-cultural understanding, global education, and well-being of Korean people around the world. The selection criteria for the award include:

- Demonstrated commitment and unselfish devotion to the well-beings of Korean community and global society,
- Significant contribution to the improvement of understanding between Korean and people around the world,
- Exceptional devotion to quality education for young generation in Korea and the world, and
- Outstanding achievement in scholarly and creative work that advances global understanding of Korea in the global community.

Profiles of the 2011 Award Recipients

Bruce Fulton, Ph.D. & Ju-Chan Fulton

Dr. Bruce Fulton is the inaugural holder of the Young-Bin Min Chair in Korean Literature and Literary Translation in the Department of Asian Studies at the University of British Columbia. Dr. Fulton obtained an M.A. in Korean Regional Studies from the University of Washington and a Ph.D. in Modern Korean Literature from Seoul National University with a dissertation on the short fiction of Hwang Sun-won. His research interests lie in modern Korean fiction and its translation; narrative style in contemporary Korean fiction; Korean women's fiction; and identity transformation as reflected in military-camptown fiction. He has co-translated several anthologies of modern Korean short fiction, including the prize-winning Words of Farewell: Stories by Korean Women Writers (Seal Press, 1989) and A Ready-Made Life: Early Masters of Modern Korean Fiction (University of Hawai'i Press, 1998); is co-editor (with Youngmin Kwon) of Modern Korean Fiction: An Anthology (Columbia University Press, 2005); and edited the Korea sections of the Encyclopedia of Modern Asia and the Columbia Companion to Modern East Asian Literature. Dr. Bruce Fulton and Ju-Chan Fulton have co-translated several books. Their most recent translations are The Dwarf by Cho Se-hui (University of Hawai'i Press, 2006) and There a Petal Silently Falls: Three Stories by Ch'oe Yun (Columbia University Press, 2008). He and Ju-Chan Fulton received the first NEA Translation Fellowship ever awarded for a translation from the Korean (1995) and the first Banff International Literary Translation Centre residency awarded for a translation from any Asian literature (2007).

Djun Kil Kim

Mr. Djun Kil Kim is Professorial & Research Chair of Samsung Korean Studies Program at University of Asia & the Pacific in Manila, Philippines. Professor Kim has been also affiliated as Scholar-in-Residence to Academia Coreana at Myongii University in Seoul since September 2003. He obtained B.A. and M.A. in sociology from Seoul National University. He had served in Korean government for more than two decades including Minister of Public Affairs at Korean Embassy in Washington, D.C. and director of the Korean Cultural Service in New York, assuming a wide array of duties in international public diplomacy. Before he ioined the government in 1977, he worked as a journalist in Korean media including the Chosun Ilbo and the Seoul Shinmun. Professor Kim has been teaching, writing, and conducting research on Korean history and culture in academes at home and abroad, including Yonsei Graduate School of International Studies, Brigham Young University, and Stockholm University, since he left the government in 1999. In 2010-11, Professor Kim wrote a monologue on Case Study of the Saemaul Undong movement in 1970s South Korea for Asia Development Bank's Regional Technical Assistance on Sharing Knowledge on Community-Driven Development. When he visited Brigham Young University to teach Korean history for a cultural exchange program of Korean studies cosponsored by the SBS Foundation, Myongji University, and the BYU in the 2003-2004 academic years, Professor Kim completed a comprehensive Korean history book for the English-speaking audience. His book The History of Korea was published in 2005 as part of the Greenwood Histories Modern Nations series by Greenwood Press in the United States.

PURPOSE

The Council on Korean Studies at Michigan State University was established formally in 1992. The council's main objective is:

- To stimulate interest in Korea among the people of Michigan and the United States,
- To seek and provide information about the Korean cultural activities,
- To exchange programs between Korea and the United States related to art, literature and science,
- To help start and continue Korea-related programs at MSU and other American
- To promote graduate and undergraduate education about Korea and related outreach programs.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership is open to all people interested in Korean affairs. The president, the officers, and the Governing Board are elected by the members as specified by the Council's bylaws. There are five types of memberships: Corporate Member, Individual Life Time Member, Benefactor, Full Member and Associate Member.

ENDOWMENT

The council established an endowment fund in 1992 to provide financial support for its activities. The fund is administrated through the Asian Studies Center in consultation with the Council. A campaign is underway to raise \$2,000,000 in endowment.

ACTIVITIES

The Council has been actively engaged in organizing international conferences, holding a series of workshops and seminars, presenting several cultural events to introduce Korean culture to the large community surrounding MSU, and publishing some publications.
